### Residential Door Kicks

We are currently experiencing a rash of burglaries where the suspects make forcible entry into residential homes by kicking in the front door. The suspects will generally select houses that do not have any vehicles in the driveway and approach the door with two or more subjects. They will usually knock on the door first to see if anyone will answer and wait approximately 30 seconds before forcing entry. During instances where someone answers the door, the suspects will make up a name and ask if they're home. They have been targeting residences north of Baseline along the 210 Freeway and I-15. The suspects are described as three to four black male adults and one black female adult. They utilize vehicles that generally fit the area and are most often rental cars (sometimes identifiable by the license plate frames). In most of the cases currently under investigation, the driver will drop off the suspects who approach the residence and drive away from the immediate area. Once the suspects exit the house the vehicle returns to pick them up.

If you see any subjects or vehicles matching this description, **DO NOT APPROACH THE VEHICLE**, call **911** immediately. Please take note of the location, direction of travel, occupants' and vehicle descriptions. If possible please stay on the line with the dispatcher until units arrive and in some cases expect a call back directly from the deputies responding to the area. Having a digital camera and/or a video camera available to photograph or film suspicious subjects and their vehicles is very encouraged and helpful in these cases.
