**SUMMARY:**

On Wednesday, March 4th, 2009, at approximately 2:45 p.m., deputies from the Rancho Cucamonga Police Station's Multi-Enforcement Team's Crime Free Multi-Housing Unit conducted a narcotic investigation at the Sycamore Springs Apartments located at 7127 Archibald Avenue, Rancho Cucamonga.

During the investigation, the above named suspects were arrested and eight more subjects were detained and identified for being involved in narcotic activity. The charges ranged from possession of narcotics with intent to sell, possession of narcotics, warrants and parole violations, including 1 parolee at large who was presumed to be armed and dangerous. The suspects were booked at the West Valley Detention Center and the cases were submitted to the District Attorney's Office for filing of felony charges.

The property management at the Sycamore Springs Apartments is a partner in the Rancho Cucamonga Crime Free Multi-Housing Program, a program that targets problem tenants who commit crimes in multi-housing complexes. The tenants of the apartment where the narcotics were being sold will be evicted, making the apartments a healthier and safer place for the residents to live. This improves the quality of life for all of the residents of Rancho Cucamonga.
